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Submissions are encouraged from scholars and practitioners in a wide range of areas: assessment, biliteracy, indigenous languages, language planning, language politics, multilingualism, pedagogical approaches, policy analysis, second language acquisition, etc. The BRJ editorial policy reflects the intrinsic and inherent value of bilingualism, biliteracy, and linguistic democracy.

The BRJ accepts manuscripts written in English or Spanish. Articles written in Spanish need not be translated, although a two-page abstract in English is requested.

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
