

Dr. Clara C. Park is Professor of ESL/Bilingual education, and teaches ESL and bilingual methods, literacy, and Korean culture and methods classes. She is currently Director of Bilingual and ESL Programs & Educating Hispanic Students Project, College of Education, California State University, Northridge. In addition, she currently directs Asian Bilingual Teacher Education Program Consortium of California State Universities.

She has been a NABE Board member since 2008; NABE SIG Chair – Asian and Pacific Islanders; Coordinator/Co-Coordinator of SIG-Asian and Pacific Islander Institute of the NABE Annual Conference, 2000-2008; a NABE member since 1986; SIG Chair – Asian and Pacific American Education & Coordinator/Co-Coordinator of Asian and Pacific American Institute of the California Association for Bilingual Education Annual Conference (1992 -2008).

Further, Dr. Clara C.
